David Lazarus shared engineering duties on the little giant. A pair of heavyweights were coupled on the rear of the consist of center-bench riding cars, adding an authentic touch.

The Museum's electric locomotive, Santa Fe 163, in its striking red & silver Warbonnet livery, also did its share of hauling passengers. Doug Ward piloted the cowl-unit, while Janice and "Smokey" Bass were the conductors.



An ALCo FA lettered "Smog Belt" headed the third train running that day. This whimsical locomotive is owned and operated by Bob & Gail Woodward. They kept the train running to the last, making sure everyone who wanted a ride got a turn around the pike.

LALS Past President Don Frozina served as Stationmaster all day, ably assisted by Roger Bacon, who was the Safety Coordinator. Adjacent to the station, Mike Houston operated the G-scale layout. Bill Barbe and Debra Turner opened the Disney Barn, with its three operating train layouts inside. Several other LALS members volunteered, making sure that all the trains ran smoothly.

The minutes from the last meeting were approved as corrected. John Tweety of New Zealand was welcomed as a new non-resident member. Party Requests: Todd Moore for 10/7 and Bonnie Kaufman for 10/25 were approved.

Amendment. Wolf Fengler proposed that we add a bylaws amendment to the upcoming ballot to eliminate the Tehachapi Loop Fund, specifically, all of Article 4, Section 4. The motion passed unanimously to place this on the ballot.

Safety. Wolf reported that he and Robert Lamont continue to work on the track geometry car. Due to the weight of our center-bench cars, each set will have it's own re-railer. Our Safety Engineer, Mark Hanlon will be here on Saturday, 10/7 to inspect, and possibly approve, the Pullman-style cars owned by several members. Wolf mentioned that the 180 lbs. per car is the correct figure, not the 80 lbs. as stated last month. Don mentioned that the new safety speeches are with David Holman for recording and should be ready soon.

Station. Roger Bacon reported that he had contact with Marilyn White of R&P about the proposed new station project.

Nominations. The following persons are running for the Board. Ron Bergmann, Bonnie Kaufman, Les Kovacs, Tim Lagaly, Steve Pike and Doug Young. John Goulding has removed his name from consideration.

Disconnect Switch. Leni Goldberg made a presentation on the safety aspects of a manual disconnect switch for electric locomotives. The Board decided to study this matter further before making any decision.

Souvenirs. Leonard Evans made a presentation on new patches, buttons, magnets and DVDs for the souvenir stand. The Board voted to approve an expenditure of approximately \$3,500 for all these items.

General Meeting Highlights

September 23, 2006

The first order of business was to accept and announce the slate of candidates from the Nominating Committee. The slate is as follows: Ron Bergmann, John Goulding, Bonnie Kaufman, Les Kovacs, Tim Lagaly, Steve Pike and Doug Young. Don asked if there were any floor nominations; there were none. Don then thanked the Nominating Committee members, John De Phillip Sr., David Lazarus and Lew Soibelman for their efforts.

Don next reviewed the happenings of the September 11th BOD meeting. Afterwards, Gary Baker talked about the LALS RM Halloween T-shirt that will be available. Sam and Liz Calderwood designed this shirt with assistance from Fred Lack. Don pointed out that the time of October General Member Meeting conflicts with the public Halloween night run that evening. After soliciting member input, the consensus was to move the time of the meeting back to 5 pm, instead of its usual time of 7 pm. The time change would be for this meeting only.

Dan O'Brien mentioned that long-time member Roger Schenck has donated his wooden machinist's tool chest with tools to the Museum. It was decided to hold a raffle, with tickets costing \$10; the drawing will be at the Holiday Banquet. It would cost many hundreds, if not thousands of dollars to furnish such a chest today.

Pole Chain Saw. Superintendent Tom Downing requested approximately \$620 plus tax to purchase a pole-mounted chain saw to assist with tree trimming. The Board approved this expenditure.

Screw Compressor. Willie Wilhelm asked for and received Board approval to expend approximately \$1,500 to service the screw compressor.

At this time, only adult sizes can be processed.

The 50th Anniversary logo will be printed on the back, plus your name and logo will be embroidered on the front. The anniversary logo will have white lettering, red ring and gold ribbon with navy text on the top, similar to the 2006 *Roster* cover. The cost for the printing and embroidery (not including the jacket price) is \$42. We need at least 12 jackets for each run and this offer will continue throughout 2007.
